FRIENDS OF CUATEMALA

Due to the generosity of the Community of Faith of St. Andrew's, we were able to continue to support the people of Guatemala in December. From funds on hand, we sent \$5000.00 to FRATERNIDAD and \$5000.00 to CEDEPCA to assist these organizations with their valuable compassionate work in Guatemala.

In the spring, we sent \$2500.00 to each of these groups. Our funds are sent through the national church office in Toronto, that ensures funds are safely sent to the correct organizations. As well, Bob Settle is in regular contact with FRATERNIDAD in Guatemala to receive updates on the ongoing work there and advise that funds are on the way.

We have been able to achieve this without holding any fundraising concerts due to Covid. You may remember that our last one was the sold out Valdy concert in our sanctuary in late November 2019. What a night that was.

Thank you for sending us donations through the St. Andrew's church office, so we can continue to support Mayan people in Guatemala.

CENTRALALBERTA FOODGRAINS GROWING PROJECT

Thank you to all individuals and businesses that helped us with this year's growing project, one of the best years in our 26 year history.

We were able to send a cheque for \$120,000 to the Canadian Foodgrains Bank in Winnipeg. The Federal Government will match the funds on a 4 to 1 basis, so our project actually raised \$600,000.

The Canadian Foodgrains Bank was established in 1983, and the United Church of Canada is one of 15 Canadian churches that comprise the registered charity. The Foodgrains Bank helps people internationally with emergency food assistance and creating long term solutions to hunger.

For the fiscal year ending March 31, 2021, it helped 989,045 people with 103 projects in 33 countries. Some of these countries include Colombia, Haiti, South Sudan, Malawi, Bangladesh and Cambodia.

THE SANCTUARY COURSE®

Sanctuary Mental Health Course

Mental health has become a part of our general awareness and conversation of late, as we head towards the third year of this pandemic. There are many reasons for this – chronic mental conditions, the anxiety and isolation of pandemic, various addictions... promoting mental health may well be something that a church like this one is well-situated to do.

During February and March, on 8 Thursday evenings from 7:30-9 pm, you are invited to participate in The Sanctuary Course, a group study/reflection program on mental health. The course has been created by a group in Vancouver called Sanctuary Mental Health (sanctuarymentalhealth.org) and has been recommended to our Region by a United Church in Calgary.


The course is designed to support people dealing with mental health issues and their loved ones and caregivers. In particular, the course is designed for church communities wishing to develop skills and understanding to promote good mental health within the congregation and in the wider community. Anyone is welcome to participate, however you may be connected to these issues and purposes.

Each session of the course will involve reading or listening to the course materials, watching a brief film, and engaging in discussion, reflection and prayer. During the course we'll cover topics such as:

- ·Understanding mental health and illness
- ·Challenging stigma
- ·The recovery journey
- ·Companionship
- ·Self-care
- ·The role of community in mental health recovery

Monique Vermegen and Dave Holmes will lead the group. We'll begin on February 10 and the group will run until March 31. We can accommodate about 6-15 participants.



FINANCE

January 2022! Happy New Year to all our St. Andrew's Church Family! May the new year be blessed with no masks - and the possibility of coffee and hugs once more! At this point, that seems like a far distant dream, however.

Although the new year may not be blessed with being mask-less, we at St. Andrew's ARE blessed with a very generous congregation. The givings in December were such that we ended the month with a significant surplus, (even though there were 2 payroll runs in the month). This surplus, plus the wonders of accounting, leave us at year end in a very positive position. Let me explain the wonders of accounting: St. Andrew's applied for, and was granted the original \$40,000 CEBA loan (thank you to Byron!) and when the extension of \$20,000 was available we were granted that amount as well. That left us with a \$60,000 loan to federal government, payable December 2022. However, if \$40,000 of the loan is repaid on time (and we have a GIC in place to do that!), then the balance of \$20,000 becomes a grant. On the advice of the auditor, we have moved that \$20,000 from a loan liability into grant income for this year. The federal government has announced January 12, that the loans are being extended interest free until December 2023.

The second very pleasant surprise arrived in the form of a letter from the United Church of Canada Foundation, containing a gift to St Andrew's of \$10,000. This gift is to be acknowledged as "a gift from a Generous Donor through their Gift Fund at the United Church of Canada Foundation". Thank you to this donor, and the national Foundation!

We would also like to welcome our new book-keeper Shannon Epp, to the finance team. Shannon is working part-time, so please don't ask for cheques to be provided yesterday. She can be contacted through the finance email: finance@lacombeunitedchurch.ca If you need immediate contact, you can text her at 403-597-2951, but please respect that she has a full-time day job, so will not necessarily respond immediately.

Thank you to everyone for all they do and give to support the St. Andrew's Church family.
