
SHOUT OUTS!

REFLECTION

With the beginning of April, I am beginning to believe in spring once again! And Easter is nearly upon us.

With Easter comes the end of Lent, and our theme of "giving up normal." I hope this season has been a fruitful one, of both reflection and practice! Just as a reminder, it's time to plan the second "party" (as you are comfortable) with those with whom you shared your intentions for Lenten practice. Even if you didn't manage an early Lent party, consider a small gathering to reflect on what this Lent has meant for you, what you've learned, what your practice has done.

Easter also coincides with the lifting of most of our pandemic restrictions, and the resumption of many aspects of church and community life. This is a blessing and a relief to most of us; we're done with distance and sick of the restrictions! As I write this, predictably, the lifting of restrictions has also led to an uptick in infection rates, and it looks like we are headed into a sixth wave. We can only hope that this wave will pass without too many hospitalizations and deaths. Still, I had hoped for a big bang, a huge celebration, to bring us back to in-person church activities. Instead, we return with joy, but also with anxiety and uncertainty. I guess that's what it will be.

In that light, I confess that I often have difficulty with Easter. You'd think as a minister that this would be a high point, and in some ways it is. But the more I study, the more complex and confusing I find the Easter stories to be, and the more mystery infuses this event. I'm like Thomas: I want to touch it, see it, experience this resurrection in a direct, clear, unambiguous way. But like the end of the pandemic, the resurrection resists clear definition. It doesn't seem to want to be touched.

Like Thomas, I want to touch the resurrection, and think I can't. But all the while, the earth is coming back to life around us, in the annual miracle called spring. The pope has issued an apology to First Nations at last, opening the door to real reconciliation at least a bit more. And each week, as a church, we take steps towards whatever our new life will be.

I wonder sometimes – do I struggle with the resurrection even while I am in the midst of it? With Jesus, unrecognized, right by our side.

Please ensure you sign in and out.


CELEBRATIONS & CONCERNS BOOK


GARAGE/BAKE/ FLOWER SALE
