


I'd like to do a Fresh Start in Faith group again this fall, likely starting in later October. This is for those new to St. Andrew's (it could be used as membership or adult baptism preparation) but it is also for those longerterm folks who would like a fresh look at the practice of faith. I'm thinking of either Tuesday or Thursday evenings for this group; if you're interested, call Jana in the office and let her know which evening(s) work for you. I'd also like to try what is often called a lectionary Bible study – a study group focussed on the Biblical text for the next worship/sermon. We're thinking of doing this at Blindman Brewing (though I have yet to arrange things with them!) on Tuesday afternoons at 4:30. This will be a drop-in study; each session stands alone, so come when you can!

Finally, I have a request. Things will be quite different with Barbara no longer on staff! One of the things we will miss is her visiting, and the care she offered in a very personal way. I won't be able to do the regular visiting that she did. My request is that if you would like me to stop by, for whatever reason (and it doesn't need to be a crisis!), please call Jana or myself to request a visit. It is much easier for me to respond to a request than to figure out who might need a visit – so if you call us, that's a huge help to me.

So... forth into the fall! Things will be different, but blessings await in the adventure that is always new!

It is a beloved tradition to invite God's love and grace by blessing each other on departing:


