A very blessed Advent and Christmas season to all of you!

There is so much going on in this end-of-year season: if the cluttered state of my desk is any indication of my life (or yours) then there are lots of things on the go, none of them completed, a couple of important things that have gotten lost under a pile, the anxious feeling of having kind of lost control of life. Of course, I also need to recognize that an awful lot of what overwhelms me are good things – a healthy active church, positive change, a rich time of worship and service, families gathering, friends gathering, real celebrations...

So my first note to myself, that I'll share in case it resonates with you, too, is to remember to savour this season. May we be present to the good things, with gratitude, and not simply overwhelmed by the tasks. Too busy we may perhaps be – but if we're busy with good things, at least let's enjoy the goodness!

I am aware that this season is hard for some – in fact, it may be all of the above, busy, good, hard, sad, scary... The celebrations may leave you cold, but the light shines for those who walk in darkness, and the darkness cannot overcome it.

This is also a season of generosity – gifts for family and friends, certainly, but also it's a time when we offer support to various community groups – Santas Anonymous, the Food Bank and Fill-A-Fridge, the Benevolent funds both for our congregation and the FCSS, and the Broom Tree foundation supporting women. Our own church typically rolls into December carrying a deficit, depending on the extra generosity of our own people to meet our expenses and climb back into the black. Our church and our partner organizations are important in this community: sources of inclusion, formation in hope, peace, joy and love, good news for the poor and healing for our society. Thank you for all you do and give, to be a blessing in this place and time. So, in the midst of a messy desk, I am grateful. Grateful for you! And as we lift others into the light, as we sing and worship, as we give to support others and our own ministries, as we bake and gift and celebrate, in our programs, groups, and even in our struggles – may we remember to savour the profound gifts of life and love that this season is all about. White Gift Sunday is coming up this Sunday, December 7! Here's all the different ways you can give...


